

Installing the ClickView Plugin for Moodle

The ClickView Plugin for Moodle enables you to quickly and safely browse through your entire ClickView library, the ClickView Exchange and your own personal Workspace from within Moodle, making it easy to embed educational videos directly into your pages and share them with your students.

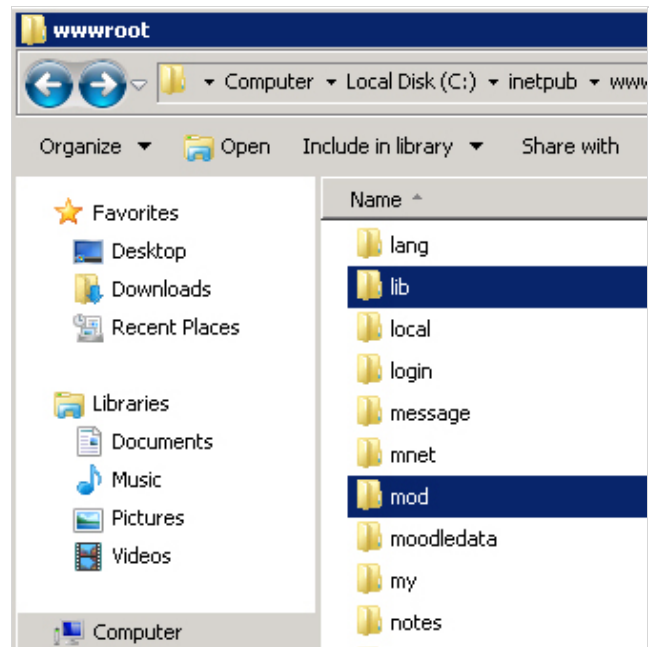
You can embed videos into your lesson plan with one click and use the fully featured ClickView Web Player to share HD videos with your students.

2 Extract the contents from the zipped plugin folder.

Copy the extracted contents into your root Moodle directory.

Log into Moodle with an Administrative account.

Click on 'Upgrade Moodle database now'.

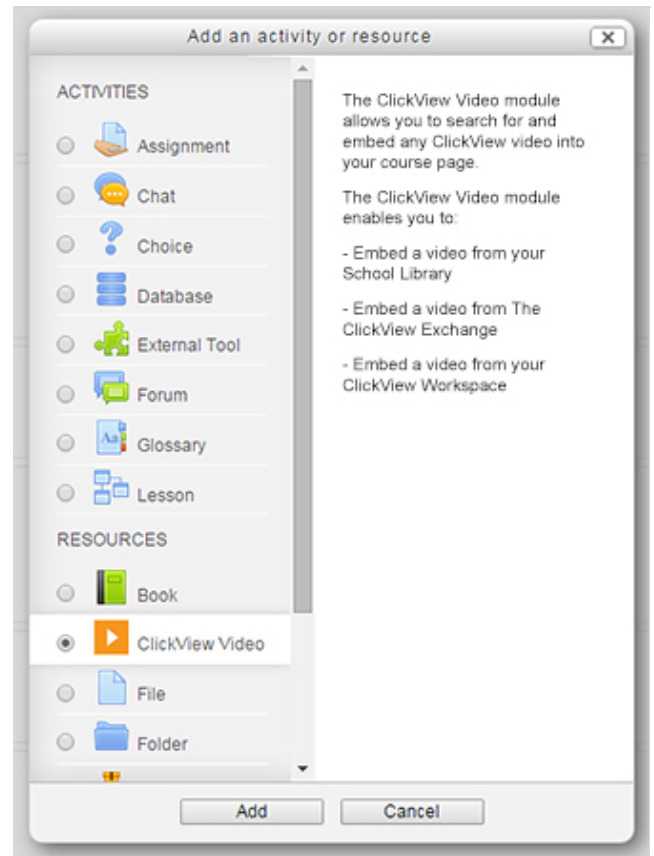
